

# NCIG Pre-arrival Safety Requirements



To ensure a safe and efficient visit to NCIG, it's important you comply with our strict safety, environmental and operational requirements.



Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is mandatory while at our berths. You must wear: safety glasses, a hard hat, hi-visibility long sleeve shirt and long pants, personal flotation device, enclosed steel-cap boots, gloves\*.  
\*(as required)



In the event of an emergency on board, use your radio and call "EMERGENCY, EMERGENCY, EMERGENCY" and ask for the NCIG Terminal Representative.



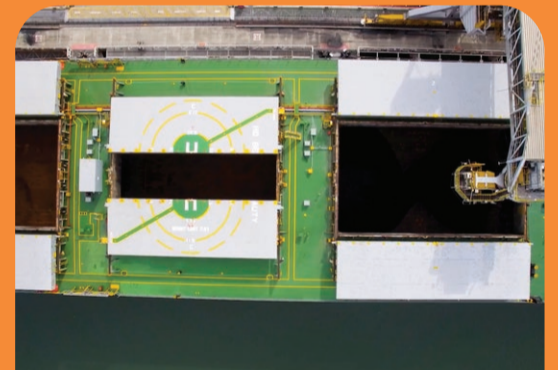
Gangways should be rigged and ready before arrival, with secondary support if they can't safely land on the wharf. NCIG can provide a brow for secure vessel access if needed.



While at berth, mooring lines must be regularly inspected and kept properly tensioned. This is a critical safety requirement and will be strictly monitored.



Hatch rail cleaning and inspections are to be completed from the deck, otherwise fall protection must be used.



Cargo hold entry at NCIG must be declared on the Ship-to-Shore Declaration. Notify the shiploader by radio before and after entry. Keep hatches partially closed during work.



Failure to comply with the above requirements may result in AMSA being notified and NCIG assessing suitability for future nominations. Please follow the directions from NCIG representatives when at our wharf area, and together we can keep each other safe and enjoy a smooth loading experience.



## Shore Leave

Shore leave is only available through authorised transport. NCIG does not permit Uber, taxis or personal transport. We have a longstanding partnership with Mission to Seafarers who are authorised to facilitate shore leave. You can arrange this by contacting them directly or through your shipping agent.
